LUNCH TIPS

PREPAID LUNCH PLAN

Lunch is included in your fee and is provided by Purchase Day Camp. Your camper can choose one entrée, one snack, one beverage and even one dessert each day! You may choose lunch for your camper daily using our Lunch Cards or you may give permission for your camper to choose lunch with their counselor each morning. This permission is given on our Lunch Authorization Form.

***If you chose to opt out of our lunch plan to bring a lunch from home. and/or order lunch from the snack bar on a daily basis using our Lunch Envelope System:**

LUNCHES FROM HOME

All lunches brought from home will be refrigerated (bags preferred). Please label all Lunch Bags with the Camper's name and Group. We recommend sending juice or milk with campers' lunches. Glass bottles are not permitted. AM Half Day Junior Campers do not eat lunch at camp.



LUNCHES PURCHASED AT CAMP ON A DAY TO DAY BASIS:

Even if you opt out of the lunch plan, you may still buy lunch on a daily basis. Lunches from the snack bar are available to Junior Leaders, T-N-T Campers, Senior Campers, Mini, and All Day Junior Campers daily. Lunch Envelopes with menu prices and daily specials is included with the complementary gift pickup provided in the spring. Additional lunch order envelopes will be sent home with campers during the first week of each child's enrollment. Extra lunch envelopes are available upon request. All Lunch orders will be taken at camper arrival time. All food from the A La Carte menu, snacks and beverages are available daily. Lunches can only be ordered on a daily basis. Substitutions for daily specials on a particular day will not be permitted.


LUNCH ORDERING TIPS:

As you know, lunch orders must be submitted in the Food Service Envelope provided to you by the camp. I have had two sons who went through the program at Purchase Day Camp and it always seemed that when my boys ordered lunch, the only money I had to give them was my last twenty-dollar bill. I knew I was going to get the change back, but what was I going to use for lunch?

I want to give you a tip for easy ordering that I used when my children attended camp. Prior to camp beginning, I would go to the bank and get two hundred dollars in singles and two rolls of quarters. On days when they would order lunch, after we calculated the total cost, I would take exact change from the cupboard and send it in with them. It was very convenient and for those of you who order frequently, it is a very efficient system.
